Community Service Directory

1. What is community service?

Community service involves volunteer work for which the student receives no payment or other extrinsic reward. The service activity takes place outside of the school setting or the beneficiaries of the work are outside of the school. Community service may be performed as an individual or as part of a group such as a school club (SADD, NHS, NNDCC, Environmental Club, etc.) or outside organization (Boy Scouts, Church groups, etc.).

2. Why should I perform community service?

When students perform community service, the “community” - be it in the form of individuals receiving help or the population at large benefiting from such things as environmental clean-ups - clearly gains. The students performing the service also benefit in a number of ways:

- Students will gain experience in working with diverse groups of people.
- Students will have an opportunity to improve their communication skills.
- Students may have the chance to explore areas of career opportunities.
- Students will learn to set and attain goals which in turn will help them realize their own potential, more fully develop their gifts and talents, and boost their self-esteem.
- Students will gain personal satisfaction and improve their citizenship skills by giving back to their community.
- Students will gain a better appreciation of their own circumstances.
- Students may benefit by fulfilling requirements for membership in honorary groups (NHS, etc.) and enhancing their chances for scholarships and college admission.

3. How can I get involved?

Membership in a number of school clubs can provide students with avenues for community service. Students should also investigate opportunities for service available through their personal house of worship. A primary purpose of this publication is to provide a listing of organizations seeking volunteers. This directory includes a description of the activity and who to contact to get involved.

4. Personal considerations:

While the school endorses the value of community service; whenever a student considers individual, self-directed volunteer service, parental approval and guidance are a must. Parents assume responsibility for transportation and any and all liability.

It is highly recommended that parents contact any agency or organization being considered for student service before beginning such service and remain in communication with them to check on the status of their son or daughter. Students are also advised to perform their service activities with a friend.
