ROTATING DROP SCHEDULE

Wall High School has transitioned to a Rotating Drop Schedule. This schedule is designed to provide students with a balanced and varied educational experience. Students are scheduled for a total of eight classes, but only attend six classes each day. The two classes that are not scheduled each day are "dropped," with the ABCD schedule rotating throughout the week.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Each student must complete a minimum of 120 credits. Each student must carry a course load of at least 40 credits per year, regardless of how many credits they have accrued. Each Wall High School student must meet the following requirements for graduation:

ADVANCED PLACEMENT PROGRAM

- 190 students took one or more exams in 25 different subjects.
- A total of 379 exams were administered with 84% of our students scoring 3 or higher.
- The College Board has recognized 64 total AP Scholars, 29 AP Scholars, 18 AP Scholars with Honor, and 17 AP Scholars with Distinction.

DUAL ENROLLMENT/DUAL CREDIT PROGRAM

- Seniors participate in Dual Enrollment with Brookdale Community College.
- Classes are taken on the BCC campus among the general population.
- Participating seniors can earn 6 credits each semester.
- Additionally, Wall High School students (grades 9-12) may enroll in the Dual Credit
 Program offered through Stockton University. Students may take pre-approved Wall
 High School courses taught by Wall High School teachers in order to earn college
 credit. A total of nineteen courses are offered.



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WALL HIGH SCHOOL ACADEMIES

WALL BUSINESS AND FINANCE ACADEMY (WBFA)

Since 2009, the WBFA has been preparing Wall High School students for life after high school. Members of the WBFA are provided many opportunities like internships, mentorships, and professional seminars that most students don't experience until they are in college.

- 80 students are enrolled in the WBFA.
- Tailor their elective choices to a focus on business and finance. They must take a minimum of 20 credits of mandatory business courses.
- Successfully complete an internship/ mentorship between the summer of their junior and senior years.
- Participate in Academy Knights professional development workshops.
- Shadow businesses/industry professionals.
- Opportunities to participate in field trips and volunteer events.
- Applications are accepted each winter from rising Freshmen only.
- Community business leaders partner with Wall High School by securing internships, shadowing experiences, volunteering in classrooms, acting as mentors, and serving on our advisory board.
- Students who complete the program will be graduates of the Wall High School Business and Finance Academy and will receive a "Certificate of Business and Financial Studies" as well as a medal to wear at their Wall High School graduation ceremony.

WALL PRE-ENGINEERING ACADEMY

The Wall Township Pre-Engineering Academy, with its innovative and rigorous project-based, iSTEM (integrative Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) curriculum, will increase technological literacy as well as better prepare students for their post-secondary education and, ultimately, a career in the field of engineering or technology/science related field.

- 83 students are enrolled in the Pre-Engineering Academy.
- Tailor their elective choices to focus on the Engineering field.
- Develop a career plan designed to keep them focused and help them make connections between what they learn in school and success in the adult world.
- Participate in professional development activities focusing on employer-desirable soft skills.
- Have access to shadowing and internship experiences in the industry with local engineering firms.
- Can network with current college engineering students and engineering professionals.
- Will receive preferential course scheduling ensuring that all students are able to complete required academy courses and program requirements.
- Build camaraderie among students with similar interests.
- Establish their professional presence before graduation.

SERVICE AND LEADERSHIP ACADEMY

This academy is recommended for students who are considering a career in public safety, public service, service science such as NASA, law, government, social services, education, clergy, or the military. What makes this academy unique, is that it is open to all students without a placement exam.

- Students who enter this academy will be expected to complete a minimum of one-hundred community service hours per year.
- Electives will be tailored towards our JROTC/NNDCC and Naval Science program with an additional focus on citizenship and community.
- Learn individual communication and leadership skills while working towards a group goal.
- Compete in academic and competitions against other schools.
- Receive promotion credit for 3 or more years of service if deciding to enlist in the U.S. Military
- Students will have a first hand look at the process to join a U.S. Military Academy or College ROTC program.
