Welcome

Lauren introduced the SEPAG Leadership Committee, which includes Co-leaders, Secretary, and Building Liaisons. The SEPAG private Facebook page which is open to any district family receiving special education services now has over 100 members.

Leah summarized SEPAG's goals and priorities for the upcoming school year, topics that were further discussed later in the meeting during the parent discussion portion:

- Increase SEPAG's presence in the district
- Promoting inclusiveness at the building level

Open Discussion

The floor was opened to attendees to ask questions and present concerns. The following is a summary of the topics discussed:

Staffing and Training

- Five new paraprofessionals are up for Board approval at the September meeting, which will fill all current positions.
- Discussed background and training for paraprofessionals:
 - Currently the minimum standard for paraprofessionals is a high school diploma
 - Our district supports paraprofessionals who are interested in receiving further training in Applied Behavior Analysis to become Registered Behavior Technicians (RBTs), though it is not a requirement for the position
- Discussed training for staff as listed in our children's IEPs; additional training specific to a child can be included in the IEP on an individual basis, such as train staff to use Assistive Technology.
- Special Area teachers (such as PE, Arts, etc.) discussed whether there may be opportunities for additional training in case specific bases, beyond the district wide lecture-based training, specifically for In Class Resource placements.

Transportation

Follow-up discussion regarding the Spring/Summer 2022 bus delays – the Transportation
Department's Excel spreadsheet, which is meant to be updated in real time, seems to be
accurate and useful this school year, in most cases. Although there may be individual delays at
times, there has not been a repeat of the delays that were seen in the past Spring and in ESY.
 Parents noted that the spreadsheet was not utilized by the Transportation Dept. during ESY.

Unstructured times

- Concern brought forth that middle school lunch period has been shortened, which does not allow for enough down time and socialization time.
- Periods of the school day with less structure (e.g., specials, recess, lunch, bussing) may be times when special education students have the least support but may need it most for promoting socialization and managing appropriate behavior.

Promoting Inclusiveness

- Allenwood School is pursuing an assembly given by an adult with autism, Tim Rohrer, to promote inclusiveness; building liaison Jenn Varga is spearheading this initiative with the Allenwood personnel and PTG.
- Discussed using the model of Circle of Friends program at Allenwood to develop similar programs in each school
 - Discussed need for identifying the proper school personnel; guidance counselors, speech and language
 - Dr. Samaha discussed the Wall Social Club in further detail, expanding on the presentation from earlier in the evening
 - Discussed the benefits of a student mentor/mentee program (similar to big brother/sister programs)

- Discussed a variety of other potential opportunities for promoting inclusion that may be led by faculty or parent volunteers (e.g., after school clubs, certain sports such as the track team, theater clubs, engage & create club, attending football games)
- Several parents brought up the concern that In Class Resource students may not currently have programs available to them to promote inclusivity and socialization, in addition to accommodations typically afforded to the self-contained classes.

Increasing SEPAG Presence

- As a group we would like to engage with more families to provide as much support as we can.
 We discussed several ways to increase meeting attendance (e.g., streaming meetings for those who may not have child care, inviting guest speakers to present a variety of topics of interest)
- SEPAG will seek to use the districts Facebook page to reach a wider audience, to announce meetings and other relevant information
- Building Liaisons are intended to be a valuable resource for families within each school.
 Discussed creating a handout for families with SEPAG information and liaison contacts to be distributed with PRISE for families receiving special education services.


